



We thank you for your patience as we work to establish the new Eastern TTAP Center at the University of Wisconsin-Madison that has just launched this summer. Through this email the Eastern TTAP Center is soliciting Tribal representatives for our Steering Committee.

Both the Eastern and Midwest Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) regions are included in the Eastern TTAP Center. TTAP provides transportation training, technical assistance, and technology services to federally recognized Tribal nations to build the capacity necessary to administer and manage their own transportation programs and systems. Dedicated to empowering Tribal communities and enhancing Tribal transportation, the Eastern TTAP Center stands to support 72 Tribal nations across thirty states. We're committed to forging a brighter, safer future for Tribal transportation through collaboration with Local and Tribal governments, federal agencies, United Southern and Eastern Tribes, Inc. (USET), other Tribal transportation affiliated organizations and dedicated partners.

Every TTAP Center is guided by a Steering Committee which provides input on the development and deployment of a Needs Assessment, Annual Work Plan, and TTAP Center services. They will assist in developing relationships between the Eastern TTAP Center and key Tribal stakeholders. Every TTAP Center Steering Committee requires a minimum 50% Tribal representation. The Steering Committee will meet virtually at minimum once every federal fiscal year quarter starting in 2024.
